CANNERY RUNNING TO CAPACITY LIMIT

Ray-Maling Company Expected to Operate Until in October

BUSINESS MEN VISIT PLANT

Busy Scene at Institution, Meaning Much to Hillsboro's Growers

A delegation of Hillsboro's business men visited the Ray-Maling Co.'s cannery Tuesday morning, and they were very much impressed with the institution which means so much to the fruit growers and small farmers of this section. The plant has been working at the strawberry crop for several days and will wind up that fruit by the end of the week unless a rain should come and increase the crop.

The big plant is scrupulously clean in all respects, from the preparatory tables clear thru to the engine room.

Over 110 women and girls are employed and from 20 to 30 men are on the payroll thru the busy season.

The payroll means much to Hillsboro and vicinity, for it gives the women a chance to make fair wages.

Mr. Maling expects to operate until in October. There will be a big run on Logans from now on until the crop is harvested, and later on the canning of beans will begin. Pumpkins will come later in the season and the apple crop will be another big item.

The cannery is one of the best equipped in the state and is so arranged as to get the best possible results as the labor proposition is the big thing.

Hillsboro is proud of the plant, for it means employment to many people throughout the summer and autumn seasons. Money earned is in the main expended in Hillsboro, and the fact that the cannery is here means that over fifty thousand dollars is earned and spent here that would otherwise be earned and expended elsewhere.

Five years ago had anyone predicted that such a plant would be in operation in Hillsboro a question of sanity would have been raised.

If the increase of acreage in small fruits continues in the next five years as it has in the past, there will be necessity for an addition to the plant.

Hillsboro is to be congratulated

that the Ray-Maling Co. put in its cannery and established on the ground floor in Hillsboro, even if it be expensive to pioneer in an affair of this kind.
