COUNTY AGENT NOTES

A state-wide poultrymen's convention will be held at O. A. C. on August 1-2-3. No one can hardly afford to miss the opportunity to hear Prof. James Rice, of Cornell University, and Dr. J. R. Beach, of California. Try and get your neighbors interested in the trip; have it announced at your community meetings and call the attention of your local editor to the importance of this meeting. We are hoping to persuade Prof. A. C. Phillips, of Purdue, to remain over and participate in the convention program.
Watts has a Livestock Club—The Watts community has organized a livestock club under the leadership of Mrs. Robert Warrens. This club of fourteen members is setting a pace for other club members of the county. Mr. Warrens is a former O. A. C. student and has taken a post-graduate course at Ames, Iowa, where she was a member of the livestock judging team which took part in the International Livestock Show at Chicago.

Livestock Judging Demonstrations Planned—Washington Co. Club Leaders have planned a series of not less than 16 livestock judging demonstrations for the various livestock clubs of the county. These demonstrations are for the purpose of giving practice to those boys and girls who wish to enter the livestock judging contest at the Banks Hog & Dairy Show September 21st.
The winning team at this contest will have the choice of participating in the livestock judging contests at the Oregon State Fair or the Pacific International. The team winning second place will contest at the place not selected by the winner.
Onion Smut Being Controlled—The second year's demonstrations and tests for the control of onion smut, at Scholls, by the use of formaldehyde indicates that this method of treatment will be satisfactory. It is a little early yet to tell just what the results for 1922 will be, but anyone can readily pick out the treated rows and untreated rows at this time. This fact is due to the ravages of the onion smut on the untreated rows.

H. P. Barss, of the Oregon Agricultural Experiment Station; J. C. Leedy, committeeman for the onion growers of Washington County, and the Farm Bureau have been active in promoting this work. In 1921 the treated areas showed a yield of 410 sacks per acre and untreated areas as low as 56 sacks per acre.
The poultry flock of Mrs. O. S. Coleman, of Forest Grove, ranked fourth among the poultry demonstration farms of the state for May. The 141 hens averaged 23.5 eggs for the month.

Jersey Club Organizes—

Through the efforts of County Project Leader, A. E. Westcott, the Washington County Jersey Club has been organized and enrolled with the American Jersey Cattle Club. This club of 21 members has in it a majority of pure bred calves, not all calves, for a few of the boys and girls own mature or nearly mature animals.
A showing will be staged at the Banks Hog & Dairy Show, at Banks, on September 20, 21 and 22. E. B. Fitts, Dairy Extension Specialist, has been scheduled to award the prizes on the stock exhibited and to assist with the Livestock Judging Contest, which will be in charge of the County Agent.

FOUR-H LEADERS

An organization to be known as the State 4-H Local Leaders Association, was formed at a meeting held Friday on the campus at O. A. C. summer session of the Boys' and Girls' Clubs of Oregon. The object of this organization is to promote closer co-operation between club leaders, to hold leaders' schools of instruction, and to give to any one seeking information all the assistance possible to make more efficient and helpful leaders for Oregon clubs.
Asst. National Club Leader A. G. Foster, of Washington, D. C., spoke of the value this organization would be to Oregon.
E. T. Troffiter, of the Tigard Reg. Rabbit Club, was elected President for one year; Mrs. Wm. Fehrenbacher, of Portland, vice pres.; A. D. Collier, of Wendling, Lane county, secretary-treasurer.
The charter membership numbers 100, and will soon reach 240.
The State Club Staff are all very much interested and believe that the secret of many questions will be solved, and much good accomplished thro this new method adopted by the local leaders themselves.
The officers are well known leaders in club work. Mr. Troffiter is a well known leader of Tigard, and thro his efforts and assistance the Tigard clubs are known all over Oregon for their

good work last year, and their record of five 100 per cent clubs last year. Each leader of Tigard's last year's clubs is also a five booster for better clubs.
Mrs. Fehrenbacher is an active leader in all work undertaken in the clubs of Portland, and as well as holding the vice presidency of this association, is chairman of the Parent Teachers, and president of the local leaders association of City of Portland.
A. D. Collier has the distinction of having organized the finest Camp Cookery club in Oregon. His class in decorative art for the club members, conducted during the season, won the highest praise from all. He is also an authority on art and goes East this summer to escape advanced degree work.
