NINE LAWS PROPOSED
Nine measures will confront the voters at the November election:
Scottish Rite compulsory education bill, under which all children between the ages of 8 and 16 years would be compelled to attend the public schools, and elimination of all private schools.
Single tax amendment to raise all taxes on real estate.
Prohibiting use of seines, traps or fish wheels for catching salmon and requiring that 50 per cent of salmon spawn must be planted in streams from which taken.
State income tax, providing for raising of one-half of the state taxes on net incomes.
Graduated income tax measure on all net incomes for state expenses with exemptions and deductions similar to federal income tax.
Portland Exposition under the terms of which Portland would levy \$1,000,000 a year for three years for financing the world's fair.
Interest rate amendment limiting the legal rate of interest to 6 per cent and the contract rate to 7 per cent.
Two constitutional amendments to permit Linn and Benton counties to levy special taxes to pay outstanding warrants.
The state will probably vote No on all these bills but the Portland Fair bill.—Manufacturers.

MILLS AND CAMPS CONSUME LABOR
Idle Men Are Rarity These Days in Oregon
HARVEST COULD USE MEN
Big Demand for Houses in City, With Building Brisk
Oregon mills and camps are running strong and the labor supply is inadequate. Idle men are rare and farmers are having trouble getting harvest hands. The rail shop strike has been dragging on, making but small difference in the general labor situation.
Hillsboro is having no trouble renting homes this Summer, the demand being greater than the supply, with new building quite brisk.

St. Helens—Long-Bell ferry is completed and in operation.
Toledo—Tourist park is being improved.
Work of grading St. Helens-Pittsburg road now complete.
Waldport cannery to run this season.
Myrtle Point—Fifth and Sixth streets being improved.
Waldport—New steel bridge to be erected over Scott Creek.
Toledo—Preparations are being made for fair.
Wallowa—Work starts on new Powwaka road.
Florence—Gardiner highway being improved.
Oregon City—County awards nine-mile paving contract.
Redmond—3.7 miles cement walks to be laid here at cost of \$19,800.
