Oscar Jacobs has just completed putting on 2480 yards of plastering for the motion picture studios at Beaverton.

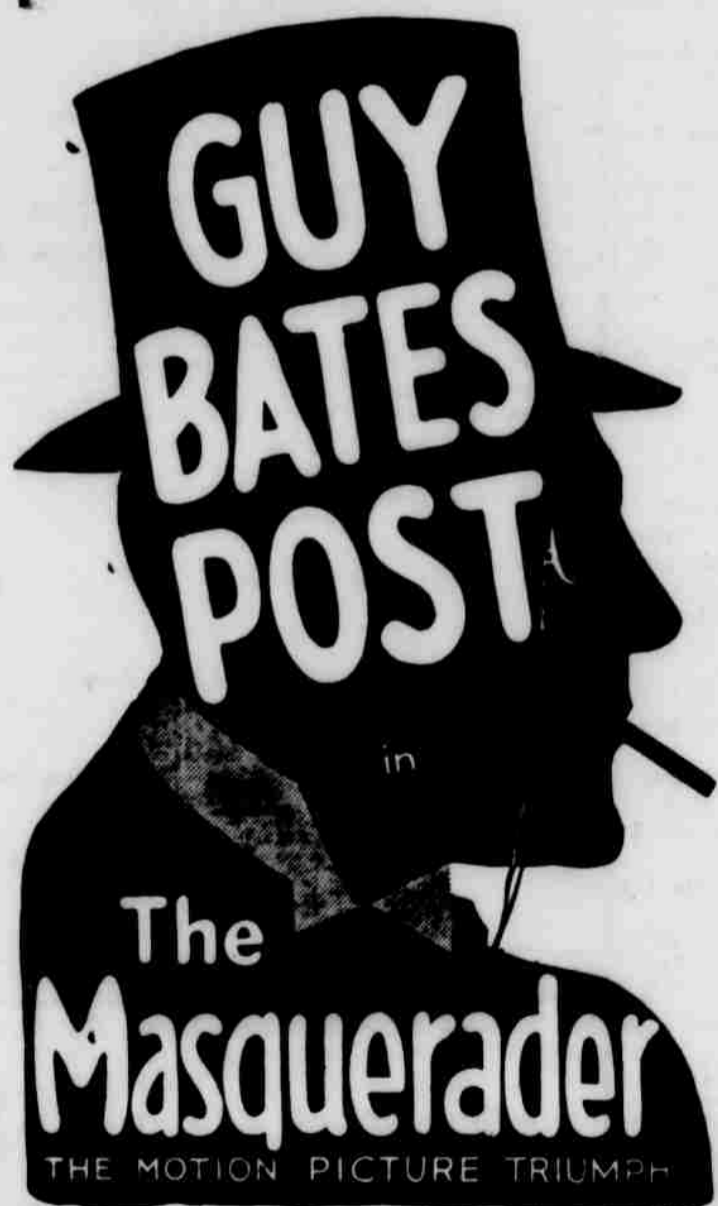
A. W. Stewart, of South Tualatin, was a city caller Tuesday.
