## Catholic Citizenship

### ARTICLE II

Article 10 stated that so many calamities against the citizenship of Catholics are directed at our attitude on Christian Education that it would seem proper to inform non-Catholic fellow citizens of our position on this important matter. A so-called Decalogue of Principles was therefore formulated. Though not authorized to speak for the other dominical schools, there is not the least doubt that these same principles set forth their attitude as well. And so:

### FIRST PLANK OF OUR EDUCATIONAL PLATFORM

was and is "Let there be universal education—that every child born or reared in the United States may have the opportunity to acquire elementary training. We now study this more in detail.

American people fairly idolize the "public" school, so that even the most unfounded suspicion that others are hostile to it has ever aroused the deepest resentment. Is it not then

### A FAIR QUESTION

to ask: What is the essence of our "public" school system in America—the real element in it that has won so warm a place in the hearts of Americans? There is, of course, their efficiency as a "melting pot," and the means they find of inculcating in children the principles of the Declaration of Independence and the Constitution of the United States. These factors will be treated more specifically later. But the most striking and therefore most popular characteristic of the "public" school is that it offers every child opportunity to receive elementary education; to assure which the child need not be rich, nor sent to the public schools all these barriers are removed automatically.

If, therefore, you analyze the system, we will find reverence for the "public" school system, will you not find the above a faithful explanation of it? But what of the Catholic attitude? Does it conflict with the above? By no means. For is not the very first principle or plank on our educational platform? And there be universal education," explain in the manner mentioned above! And this plank or First Precept of our Decalogue on Education

### NECESSARILY REPRESENTS OUR POSITION

both as Catholics and Catholics. For as CITIZENS we must heartily endorse the sentiments of the Most Rev. Archbishop Christie in his recent pastoral letter to all Catholics of his archdiocese: "The average American citizen is proud of our educational achievements here in the United States. And we have good reason to be so. For everywhere throughout the land the school is in evidence, the diffusion of learning goes on. The percentage of those who can read and write is rapidly increasing. God grant that it may soon reach 100 per cent."

### AS CATHOLICS

moreover, in our age and country, we have everything to lose by being ignorant and misunderstood, everything to gain by being known as we are. But since four-fifths of the people of our great country are not Catholics, we must depend upon their intelligence, fair-mindedness and sense of justice in every crisis of the present. WERE AMERICA 40 PER CENT ILLITERATE TOMORROW THE CATHOLIC CHURCH WOULD DOUBTLESS BE PERSECUTED UNTO BLOOD. An ignorant, illiterate mass of humanity easily succumbs to scrupulous political and social agitators. And these we have always with us. In such conflicts, sound ever-remembered sense, audacity, unshakable calm, defiance and prejudice enthrall justice and virtue. The fact that in certain States, the status of the United States, where anti-Catholic feeling is rampant, literacy is highest. Does this not exemplify the above statement? No, we Catholic citizens have learned from centuries of historical experience that we have everything to gain by education and enlightenment within and without the church. We have everything to lose by the opposite.

Therefore, even aside from the patriotic motive, self preservation would of itself inspire the first basic principle of our Decalogue, "Let there be universal education." The more the better—let ignorance and illiteracy be banished from the land forever. Our enemies, however, would point to

districts in South America and other tropical or semi-tropical countries where illiteracy enchains a large percentage of the population. We answer that ignorance in these countries has been due to climatic conditions, mixture of national characteristics, political conditions, and NOT to any teaching standard or fixed policy of Catholics AS SUCH or their official church in stead of these tropical or semi-tropical countries, why not take the culture of Europe as a criterion and signal out the

### GREAT UNIVERSITIES

which have been spreading their light of learning and literacy for centuries. The most comprehensive list available at this time shows that up to 1911 there had been founded throughout Europe 147 universities. Of these 111 are Catholic and 31 are of non-Catholic or Protestant origin. Some of Europe's greatest institutions of today are of Catholic ORIGIN, i. e., Oxford and Cambridge of England, the Sorbonne of Paris, etc.

These facts are not introduced in criticism of Protestant dominations in America, whose zeal for education needs no elucidation. They are referred to solely as an element in the defense of the citizenship of Catholics, and incidentally at this time, to defend our inalienable rights threatened by the vicious, anti-religious, anti-private school bill to be voted upon next November.

### "RELIGION IN POLITICS"

Quoting again from the official pastoral letter of the Catholic Archbishop of Oregon: "Whereas, on the one hand our Catholic people have never said, nor has it ever been seriously suggested that you should unite on questions of a purely political character; yet on the other hand, when the natural constitutional rights of thousands, even millions of Catholic citizens are gravely endangered, then, in such an emergency, even purely spiritual leaders would be directed in their duty did they not urge upon the Catholic people a justifiable energetic defense." The crisis referred to is the anti-religious, anti-private school bill now pending in Oregon.

Today we find the all-allegorical politician "deploring the injection of religion in politics," and in the next breath endorsing the so-called compulsory education bill, which would deprive thousands of citizens of their religious liberties in one of its most important details—the right to follow their religious convictions, religious opinions in the matter of education, the privilege of rearing their own children according to the dictates of their consciences, which the constitution of the United States and Oregon SPECIFICALLY grant. "Pure Americanism," if it means anything to politicians, should at least include adherence to the principles of the Declaration of Independence, the Constitution of the Union and the states. Loyal Americans who are zealous for justice and law for country will certainly concur in these sentiments. If by this denial of our constitutionally guaranteed religious liberty they are not injecting religion into politics, then words rather than deeds are the test of facts and figures.
