## COUNTY TAX ROLL HAS \$467,365 INCREASE

Assessor Boley has finished the 1923 summary of taxation for Washington county, covering the tax roll, which goes to collection after the first of the year, and the figures show some interesting comparisons. Farmers are tilling 1205 acres more in 1923 than they were in 1922. The total tax valuations for 1923 are \$23,283,960, as against \$22,816,595 for the year of 1922, and on the tax roll for the year now closing.

Thus the valuation for the coming tax roll is \$467,365 of an increase over the last roll.
