

ONE OF ONLY FIVE IN STATE TO VOTE

Tozier Tells of Convention in 1912, Electing Democratic President and Vice

Portland, Ore., Dec. 31.—(To the Argus)—Relative to the late John Wall, let me state that he was something more than a delegate to the convention that nominated Woodrow Wilson in 1912 and was one of the successful electors that year, and had the distinction of being one of the only five people in all Oregon who ever voted directly for a Democratic president. There are thousands of persons in Oregon who claim to have voted for a Democratic president but such is not the case. Under our form of government we choose electors and they do the voting. In Oregon in 1912, owing to the aid given by Theodore Roosevelt, the vote of Oregon for the first time in 43 years went to the nominee of the Democratic party, and in January, 1913, the electoral college of Oregon, organized by the election of John M. Wall, chairman. A vote was taken and the following persons voted for Woodrow Wilson for president and Thomas Marshall for vice-president of the United States—John M. Wall, Hugh McClain, Will M. Peterson, W. H. Whitten and Albert Tozier, thus making them the only persons in Oregon voting for a democrat for president. When a name was drawn to ascertain whom should be the messenger to take this vote to the national capitol, Hugh McClain's name was the lucky one. Owing to the condition of the roads in Southern Oregon, the messenger came near failing to arrive in Washington in time to have the vote counted. It was necessary to hire special conveyances to enable him to get out of Coos county.

ACCIDENTS CLAIM MANY

Reports Tell of Injuries and Loss of Life Among Hunters

Hunting accidents resulted in the death of five persons and injury of eight others in Oregon during the Fall seasons on deer, small game and birds.

This toll of human life was revealed in the summary of accident reports completed this week by the Oregon State Game Commission. A careful check of all fatalities and injuries has been supplied the commission through district deputy game wardens.

FIXED PRICE FOR CALVES

Directors of the Grays Harbor county, Washington, cow testing association have fixed the price for calves from grade association cows from purebred sires as follows: From cows with records of 300 to 350 pounds of butterfat, \$12; from 350 to 400 pounds, \$15; and above 400 pounds of butterfat, special prices depending upon the breeding.

Washington county has twice the number of dairy cows, but no cow testing association, and no special market for grade heifer calves as has Grays Harbor and Tillamook counties.
