Wheat Still Active

Salem, Aug. 24.—The wheat market continues active and prices are firm, with bids on Monday of \$1.32 for white and turkey, and \$1.27 for

soft red. There was a good export demand, with sales of over 1,000,000 bushels. Terminal receipts of wheat at Portland Monday were 372 cars, and to date this season 5,178 cars. The receipts at Tacoma for the season to date were 760 cars; at Seattle 1,552 cars, and at Astoria 128 cars.
