Centralization of business control was pictured as the basis of the world's present economic woes by Montville Flowers, radio speaker and organizer and founder of the Western Merchants & Manufacturers' association, in an address before approximately 1,000 persons in the Hillsboro union high school auditorium. Mr. Flowers addressed his remarks to the farmer.

Changes Cited

"The outstanding change of the times is the drift toward centralization, the making of one out of many, in all economic and social problems," stated Mr. Flowers. "De-centralization is the thing now most needed. The tendency toward centralization is shown in government, by dictatorship and the overthrow of old regimes.
