

Manager Henry Talks Tuesday To Laurel Unit

W. W. Henry, manager of the dairy co-operative association, discussed the basic average principle and volume of milk in the association at the meeting of the Laurel unit Tuesday evening. Volume, he said, until the last period has been increasing while consumption has shown a marked loss. In the last 15 days milk going into the city has fallen off 3,000 pounds a day and consumption has dropped 11,000 pounds a day.

Association is making checks on tests, he said, and asked that anyone that is not satisfied with the test get a composite sample and the association tester will check with them. If there are any difficulties, criticisms or misunderstandings they should be brought to the association that they may be cleared up, he said.

Mr. Henry warned that there would be propaganda in the field against the association, but that the members should consider the source. Possibility of several distributors breaking their contracts was voiced by Mr. Henry.

Mrs. Wismer Asks For Word of Seals

"Several hundreds of people in Washington county no doubt would be surprised if told that they are adding to the difficulties of the twenty-fifth annual Christmas Seal sale," said Mrs. J. J. Wismer, county chairman of the sale, this week.

"These persons have not acknowledged the Christmas seals mailed to them at Thanksgiving," Mrs. Wismer continued. "If they do not at once pay for the seals sent them, or for as many as they can, or acknowledge the letter containing the seals, the work of the county health association is increased as well as its expense account."

"Seal sale booths have been opened at various points in the downtown sections of Hillsboro, where the Christmas greeting stamps may be purchased by those who have not yet bought their supply for this year. Hillsboro city school board has authorized the sale of seals through the school system, and the boys and girls will begin their campaign at once. Girl Reserves of the union high school are also assisting.

The Heppner Gazette-Times is the present holder of the cup, and according to the terms of the contest, cannot enter competition this year. The Hillsboro Argus won the cup the first year of the contest, and will be allowed to compete again in the forthcoming contest.

News and content, editorial page, front page, mechanical make-up, and advertising are the main points on which the papers will be judged, according to Robert Allen, Eugene, in charge of the contest, and Ralph David, Woodburn, president of the organization. Bi-weekly newspapers will be invited to enter the contest, as well as the weekly papers, those in charge state.
