ON OREGON FARMS

DALLAS—The wheat yield in Polk county is expected to be considerably decreased this year to Hessian fly aphids, rust and lack of sufficient soil nitrogen, because of the dry season. Mr. Beck, county agent, says it is said to be damaging some fields of fall wheat to such an extent that owners will pick up at least part of them, Mr. Beck says. In some cases entire stands of wheat are being killed, and in others just part of the branches. The heavy outbreak of the fly is largely due to the open fall, early planting of wheat and the large amount of stubble left in clover fields last fall. There is no field treatment for controlling this pest.
