### Court Explains Old Age Pension

(Continued from page 1) creation of the commission, while residing in the state of Oregon be entitled to an old age pension subject to the restrictions and qualifications hereinafter noted.

or if married and not separated from husband or wife, if the value of his or her property, together with that of such husband or wife exceeds \$3000.

"The claimant must not have deprived himself or herself, directly or indirectly, of any property for the purpose of qualifying for old age relief.

"There are other restrictions and qualifications of a minor character all of which are set forth in a statement which is mailed to every applicant.

"It has been contended by many applicants that the law provides the payment of a pension of \$30 per month to each claimant who proves his or her eligibility. This is an erroneous idea. The law provides that the amount of pension shall be fixed by the commission with due regard to the condition of each case, but in no case shall it exceed \$30 per month including any amount which the claimant may have from any other source.

"The law further provides that the commission may require as a condition to the granting of a pension that all or any part of the pension be transferred to the commission which then has the authority to manage the property including the power to sell, lease or transfer such property.
