## Poultrymen Plan Meets

H. E. Cosby Discusses Problems of Growers

The first of these questions was, "How much and what grain should be fed to the laying pullets?" He pointed out that wheat, corn, oats, and barley were the principal grains fed poultry in Oregon and that the amounts and proportions in which these are fed is determined largely by such conditions as the contents of the mash and the availability and the relative prices of these grains. Generally speaking, however, a satisfactory amount is about 12 pounds of grain per day per 100 birds when they are in or past 50 per cent produc-

The question often arises regarding the value of oats. He claimed that they are very essential to the poultry scratch ration and that they can be fed up to about 20 per cent of the scratch. Heavy whole oats are generally preferred to oat groats. This is particularly true where the poultryman has an opportunity to buy up a supply of oats at harvest time and store them since the groats cannot be stored without the danger of their bewithout the danger of their becoming rancid.






