1935 Budget Estimates—Washington County, Oregon

Pursuant to the provisions of Section 69-103 of the Oregon Laws of 1933 and to the provisions of Section 69-601 of the Oregon Laws of 1934 as amended by Section 486 of the 1933 Session Laws of Oregon, notice is hereby given that the County Court of Washington County, Oregon will meet at the Venetian Theatre in Hillsboro, Oregon, on Friday the 30th day of November, 1934, at 10 o'clock A. M., of said day and at the said time and place opportunity will be given for a full and complete discussion of the estimates of the amount of money proposed to be raised by taxation for the ensuing year as published hereon, subject to such tax levy when made, in favor of or against any of the proposed tax levies herein as the County Court may deem for the best interests of Washington County.
