State Budget Cut Made Continuation of Pay Cuts Approved

SALEM—State appropriations for the forthcoming biennium set forth in the new budget as having been approved by Governor Meier total \$10,017,982.

In spite of a normal increase in the population of state institutions and the materially increased cost of commodities used by these institutions the budgets for all of the institutions have been held down to the level of the current biennium.

Profits from the sale of hard liquor in state stores and agencies had passed the \$500,000 mark on November 30, according to a report by Administrator Sammis.

Governor Meier has extended executive clemency to 138 inmates of the Oregon penitentiary during the past four years, according to records at the state prison.

John H. Carlin has been reappointed as a member of the state commission. His commission was signed by Governor Meier and Secretary of State Stadelman.

Babson Sees Good Gains in Business

Strong Farm Prices in 1935 and Increase Buying Power Predicted

BABSON PARK, Florida.—General business will show a moderate gain in the first six months of 1935 over the first half of 1934.
