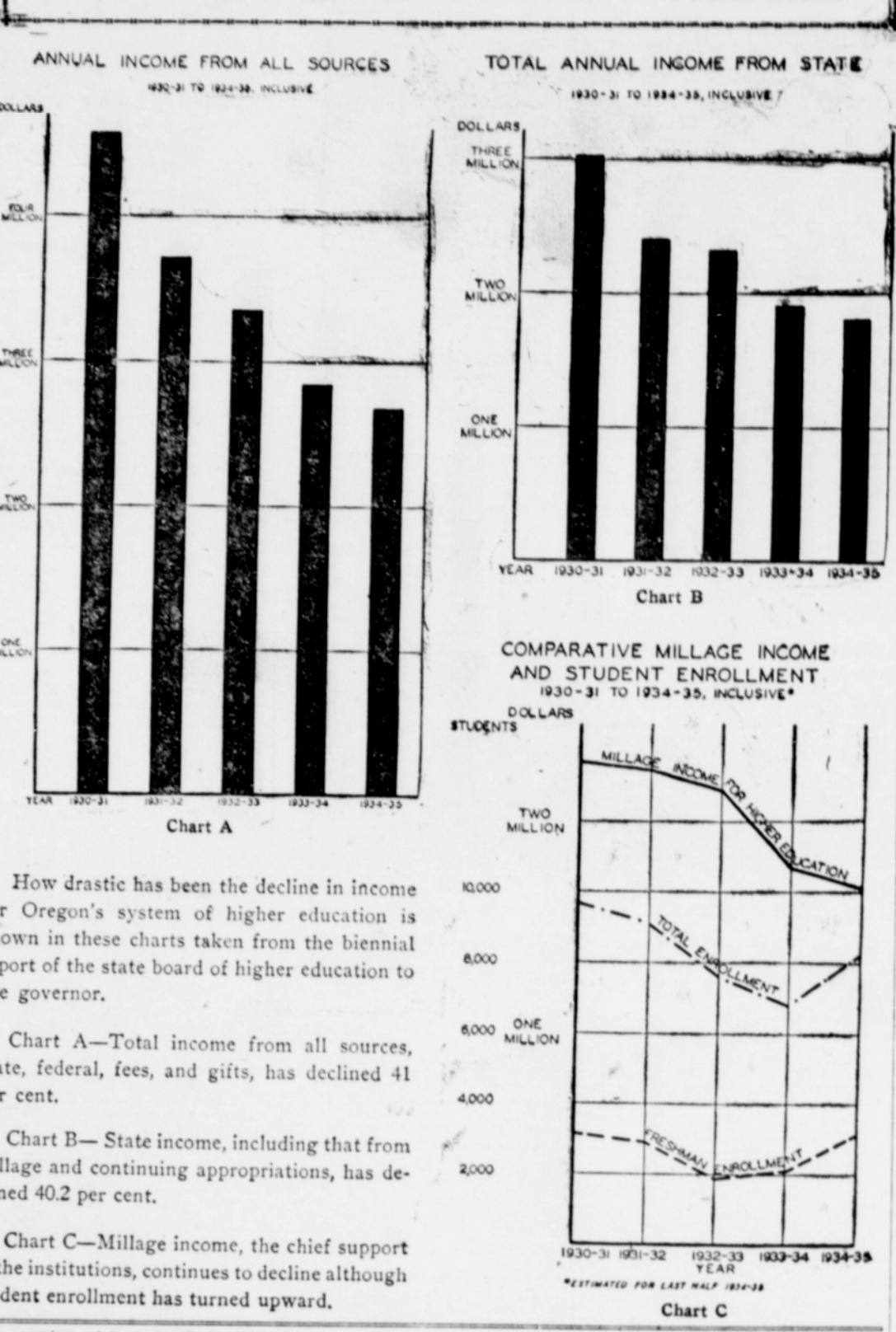

Chart A—Total income from all sources, state, federal, fees, and gifts, has declined 41 per cent.

Chart B—State income, including that from millage and continuing appropriations, has declined 40.2 per cent.

Chart C—Millage income, the chief support of the institutions, continues to decline although student enrollment has turned upward.
