The eagle screamed in Hillsboro last week for members of the local National Guard unit and left no stone unturned in its search for recruits.

The state pays for rental of armory and incidentals such as heat and light, thus leaving an additional \$400 a year in Hillsboro.

The following men were recently promoted: Laurence Hanel to sergeant, Wayne Rood to corporal, and Millard Morley to private first class.

The company is looking forward to the annual encampment in June. This year the duty is to be close to the guard post, outside of such incidental things as experienced in the mobilization at Camp Witzoombe in July during the longshoremen's strike. This year's camp is rumored to be a division camp consisting of the National Guard of the states of Oregon, Washington, Idaho and Nevada, located near Fort Lewis, Wash. This will be a big camp with close to 1000 soldiers, and should remind some of the old soldiers of war-time camps.

This means two vacancies which will be filled from the waiting list. The local company has applicants who are so eager to join that they drill with the company without pay until a vacancy occurs.
