Mountain Home Ladies' Aid will meet at the parsonage Thursday, March 14.

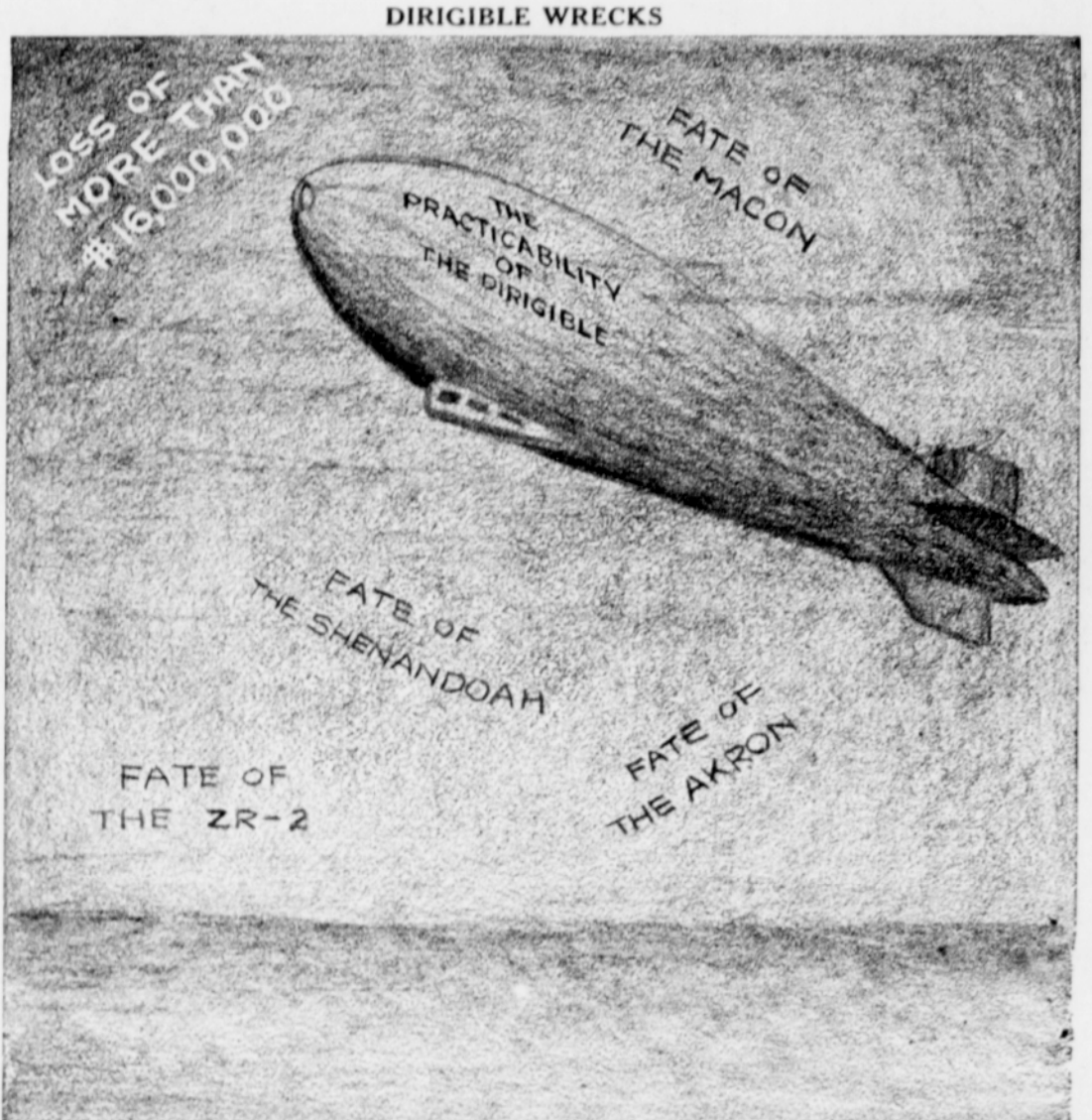
