Grange Observes Its 61st Anniversary April 22

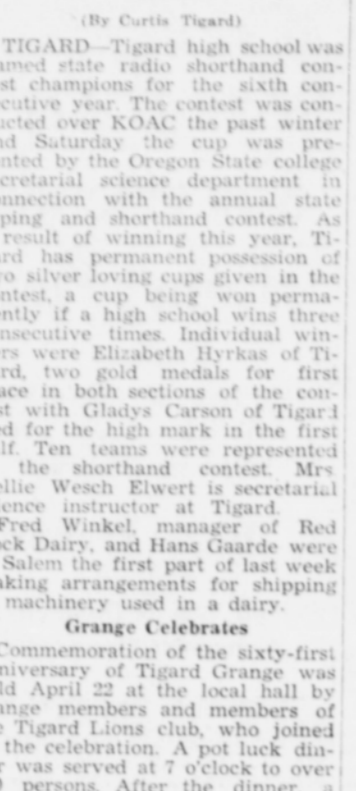
