Forward Step
The city council is taking a forward step in the advancement and progress of Hillsboro by taking action for providing sewer facilities for that part of the city not served at present. Hiring of an engineer to make a preliminary survey and a report immediately is asked in order to make a PWA application for the project as soon as possible.

Sewage and drainage in the sections of Hillsboro not handled by the present sewer district have been a serious problem for years and steps have been taken in the past, only to be combatted by those who felt it would be confiscatory to property. Under the PWA and with plans as contemplated this objection would be overcome.

Dr. J. O. Robb advocates a rental basis, which he says has been used successfully in many other places. This would make it easy to pay for and desirable to all.

Adequate sewage facilities would make those parts of the city more desirable places to live in, would increase property values and in some cases would undoubtedly stimulate building. It is to be hoped that the council is successful in bringing about this project from a sanitary standpoint and in an effort to help the employment situation.
