(Continued from page one) an outfall system and treatment plant to serve the entire city. Cost of constructing the sewer in that portion of the city east of Fifth avenue was estimated at \$52,000 and for the areas west of Adams street and north of Jackson street at \$41,000.

Costs of the outfall line and treatment plant for the entire city were to be retired over a period of 25 years through revenues from a system of charges for use of the sewer system, according to Cunningham's plan.

Dr. J. O. Robb favored retiring a greater percentage of the costs of the entire improvement on the revenue basis and reducing direct assessments to real property. Such a plan would be more equitable as residents would pay in proportion to the benefits received.
