Native Son of Hillsboro Dies

Dr. C. B. Brown of Portland Buried Here Monday

Dr. Charles B. Brown, 63, Hillsboro native son and one of Portland's oldest practicing dentists, died early Friday morning at the Good Samaritan hospital in Portland. He suffered a stroke in his office in the Morgan building Thursday morning. Dr. Brown never regained consciousness.

Dr. Brown was one of seven charter members of the Portland Automobile club, one of its organizers and first treasurers. With J. C. Ainsworth and H. Wempe, he served on a club committee which oiled the first highway in the state—Linnton road. This was in May, 1905, and was a historical event in Portland automobile circles. The club spent \$1830 in the oiling. For two years, 1903 and 1906, he was in charge of the club's racing program, sponsoring events at the old Irvington track and on Baseline road. His other interests were fishing, hunting and river sports. He was a Mason, a member of the Elks lodge and of the Isaac Walton league.

Dr. Brown is survived by the wife, Bessie Brown; a son, Dr. Hoyt Brown, and a grandson, and a brother, John M. Brown, of Buxton. His first wife, Mrs. Clara B. Brown, died in 1909.

Funeral services were held in Portland Monday morning and interment was in Hillsboro cemetery.
