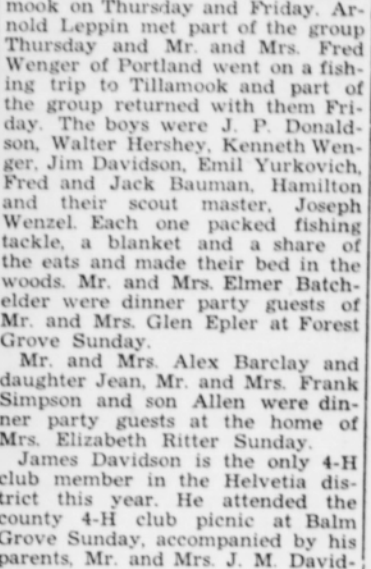

Secretary Wallace told the committee that he understands the peculiar situation confronting the growers of the inland empire, and said that if conditions become such that price levels are threatened in this region he will not be unsympathetic toward taking such steps as may be necessary. Such operations are specifically authorized by the AAA. Meanwhile announcement has been received from Washington that the AAA will seek a goal of some 53,000,000 acres of wheat under contract for the next four-year program just being launched.

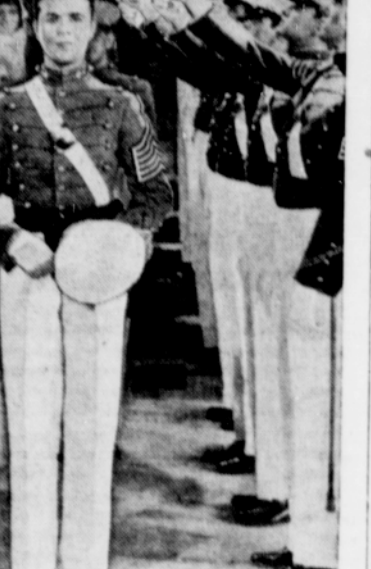

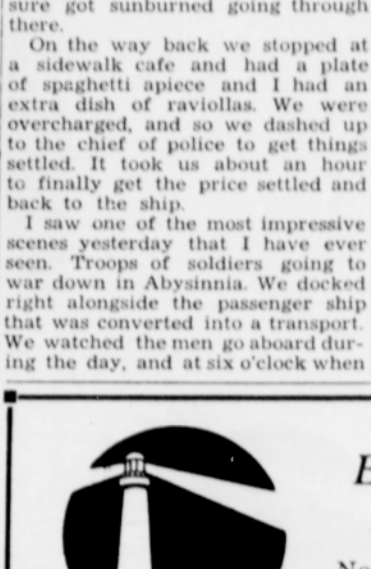
