Locals Defeat Tualatin Nine

Joos Squad Scores 16 to 4 Victory on Sunday

Hillsboro clinched the second-half championship of the Sunset league Sunday afternoon by slaughtering Tualatin 16 to 4 in a post-season playoff game at Tualatin. This Sunday the locals will travel to Aloha to open the three-game league championship series with the first half title-holders.

Tualatin opened the scoring in the first inning with one run on a walk and three base hits. Hillsboro came back with a vengeance in the second to score eight tallies on six hits, two walks and four errors. The final result of the game was never in doubt from that point on.

Hillsboro batsmen smashed 15 hits off Montague and Bud Swope, Tualatin hurler, while Roy Brandaw, local pitcher, held Tualatin to six scattered hits and whiffed eight batters. Swope replaced Montague at the close of the second inning with the score standing 8 to 1 in favor of the Hillsboro squad, but he was unable to hold down the slugging local batters.

Revamped infield was started against Tualatin in the crucial game and turned in one of the best performances seen to date in the Sunset league. Roy Brandaw was given the pitching assignment, while Rosky, star chucker, was shifted to third base. Don Shattuck held down shortstop position. "Whitey" Matson second and Dick Sutherland first. Balance of the lineup found Bill Joos in left field, Hanna in center and Austin Scrofford at right.

Matson and Joos led the hitters with three safe hits, while Shattuck, R. Brandaw and Scrofford each chalked up two. Brandaw not only pitched a fine game but came up with a triple and a double when they were needed.

Local players expressed their appreciation of the support given them at Tualatin Sunday by Hillsboro fans. They promise another high caliber game at Aloha Sunday. The second game of the championship series is scheduled for the Shute park diamond in Hillsboro September 1.

Aloha lost to Sellwood 4 to 2 Sunday in a practice game on the Sellwood field. Lances, Aloha, came up with a triple and two safeties out of four trips to the plate.
