Locals Win Second Game

Hillsboro Squad Opens State Tourney Here on Sunday

Staging a fighting comeback after dropping the first game of a double-header with Aloha 3 to 2 at the Shute park diamond last Sunday, the local Sunset leaguers won the second tilt 7 to 2 to grab the play-off series and the 1935 league championship. This Sunday afternoon the Hillsboro squad will meet Hammek's Pharmacy, Clackamas county champions on the local diamond in the first elimination game of the Oregon State championship tournament.

Streak of wildness in the first inning by Pitcher Brandaw cost Hillsboro the initial game. R. Brandaw struck out the first two Aloha men that faced him. Then an error and a hit put runners on third and second. The star hurler's control then wandered and he walked three men in a row to stake Aloha to two runs.

For the next five innings, Brandaw kept Aloha handcuffed by striking out 19 men during the game to set a new strike-out record for the Sunset league.

Hillsboro scored its first run in the fourth frame, when Rosky doubled and scored on an infield out. Aloha brought in the winning run in the seventh on triples by Jubit and McBrean. The locals had their best chance to cop the game in the last of the ninth when Rosky doubled and scored when Matson was safe on an error.
