SALEM--The capital city is making ready for the invasion of the lawmakers who are expected to arrive Sunday in readiness for the opening of the special session Monday morning.

Carpenters have been busy this week fixing up the temporary legislative chambers in the Marion hotel and the army, where the sessions will be held.

Democrats of the house have been called to caucus Sunday afternoon in an effort to get together on one of the half dozen or more candidates for the speakership, left vacant by the resignation of John C. Coker to accept a federal job.

President H. L. Corbett will call the senate to order while Fred Ward, veteran chief clerk of the house, will perform their function in the hall of representatives.

Organization of the senate will be a mere formality, with re-election of all the staff that performed during the special session.

Restoration of the agricultural codes through legislative action will be attempted at the special session according to Solon T. White, director of the state department of agriculture.
