He was a member of the A. F. and was completed by him in superintendent of construction and took charge of the work between Albany and Yaquina.

In 1886 he was engaged by the Union Pacific to take charge of all construction, building many of the branch roads and parts of the main line connecting points along the northwestern Pacific coast.

Secret surveys for the Union Pacific were made by him in conjunction with a large engineering force in 1899.

From then on he was identified with numerous similar construction jobs, building at Heppner, Elgin, Prineville, Klamath Falls, Dallas, and Castle Rock and Mar-cus Wash, all of which he operated until sold.

Other similar ventures were in California and in addition he constructed 500 miles of telephone line in Klamath county.

In 1912 he organized the Hillsboro Power & Investment Co. and since then had been actively engaged with his son, O. B. Gates, in the manufacture of water pipe.

Throughout the life of the G. A. R., Mr. Gates was actively associated with it and served as state commander in 1899.

During the years 1893-94 he served in the Oregon legislature and
