1936 Budget Estimates—Washington County, Oregon

Pursuant to the provisions of Section 60-1108 of the Oregon Laws of 1930 and to the provisions of Section 60-601 of the Oregon Laws of 1930 as amended by Section 2, Chapter 416 of the 1933 Session Laws of Oregon, notice is hereby given that the County Court of Washington County, Oregon, will meet in the Circuit Court Room in the Washington County Courthouse in Hillsboro, Oregon, on Friday, the 8th day of November, 1935, at the hour of ten o'clock A. M. of said day and at the said time and place opportunity will be given for a full and complete discussion of the estimates of the amount of money proposed to be raised by taxation for the ensuing year as published hereunder by any taxpayer subject to such tax levy when made, in favor of or against any of the proposed tax levies herein as the County Court may see fit for the best interests of Washington County.

The County Budget Committee for Washington County, Oregon, has prepared and submits the following: An estimate of the amount required for each department of County government, County office, or County officer, each County improvement, the maintenance of such County building, structure or institution, the salary of each County officer or employee, including those whose salaries are fixed by statute, for the improvement and maintenance of public highways, roads, bridges, the construction, operation and maintenance of each public utility and redemption of outstanding warrants, the estimate of the receipts of the County from sources other than direct taxation upon real and personal property during the period for which such tax is to be levied and an estimate of the probable unappropriated and unexpended balances in the funds of the County.
