

Pepco Adding to Extensions

Power Sales Boosted with Recovery in Business

With power sales boosted by local business recovery, the Portland General Electric company is spending \$675,000 on service projects now underway in its territory, reports R. R. Easter, local division manager.

Additional equipment is being installed in the Hillsboro substation which will cost in excess of \$400. In the past several months, Pepco has sold more energy in its area than in the corresponding months of any previous year in its history. The expansion of consumption is

forcing the company to make additional connections, extend lines and purchase new equipment. At a cost in excess of \$50,000, high-tension transmission lines between the hydro-electric plants and Portland substations have been reconstructed during the last few months.

A duplicate transmission line is under construction from the Bull Run plant to Sandy to augment and insure service in that vicinity. New substation equipment is required at the generating plant for this service and installation of this equipment is nearing completion. Line extensions to serve both rural and urban customers are being made in many sections of the territory served, from Vancouver, Wash., to Salem, and additions and betterments to existing lines are continuing in progress.

However, the project depends upon materials, rentals and quarters to be furnished by the Washington county relief committee. In this connection R. W.
