Specifications have been passed by government officials.

Data collected by McGee for PWA officials in Washington in connection with the sewer plans, discloses that per capita consumption of water in Hillsboro is 50 gallons for each water connection. There are 1070 active connections at present, an increase of 25 in a year, the figures show. The average was taken over a five-year period, using only winter and spring months and excluding figures which include seasons when property holders might be irrigating.

Labor specifications still are lacking, McGee said, while definite figures probably cannot be released until bids have been let. This is due to the fact that no one knows yet what type of machines will be used in excavation and how much labor will be allotted to hand work.

member at 7 p. m. at the Christian church, President R. L. Putnam concluded his report of the first Townsend national convention in Chicago at the gathering Sunday. He quoted Martin F. Smith of Washington, member of Congress, who attended the convention as a delegate and speaker, as saying, "I have been studying and investigating the Townsend Old Age Revolving Pension plan, a plan for national recovery, for over a year and a half. It extends far beyond a mere system of pensions. It is a permanent recovery measure, a real employment measure, a sound financing, a banking measure, and constitutes a practical application of the wise and salutary principles of Christianity to the solution of the social and political problems of America."

It was announced that Rev. Henry Young would speak for the North Plains club Tuesday evening and that President Putnam has been invited to speak at Yamhill December 4 and Beaverton December 6.

voice in the matter he would "go down the line" for Washington county dairymen.

Of the tax bills, Ross said that there were two sides to these matters and intimated that he favored a federal old age pension bill rather than a state and federal. "The most logical way," he declared, "is to take the federal plan whether it is the Townsend plan or some other. He was opposed to a sales tax."

When Senator Aitken spoke he pointed out the increasing popularity of the sales tax as evidenced by the numerous states adopting this form. Oregon is surrounded by sales tax states, he said, and we will have to follow here with a sales tax sooner or later.

In support of his argument he cited taxes on land owned by himself in California, where before that state passed the sales tax his taxes were nearly \$50. His last tax statement disclosed a reduction of a federal old age pension from the new form of taxation.

He also called attention to the multiplicity of laws in all states and said in this connection that the time must come when a convention of states will be called to coordinate the laws making all regulations more uniform.

R. W. Weil, called on in behalf of the Red Cross membership drive, declared that it was the desire of the local chapter to complete the drive by Thanksgiving and appeal to the businessmen to give in their memberships at once. He pointed out that the Red Cross spent \$700 in relief work during the last year, the money going to equip the county ambulances and to furnish glasses for school children with defective vision, as well as relief and disaster.

Next meeting will be in charge of Howard Hadley with a program to be announced later.
