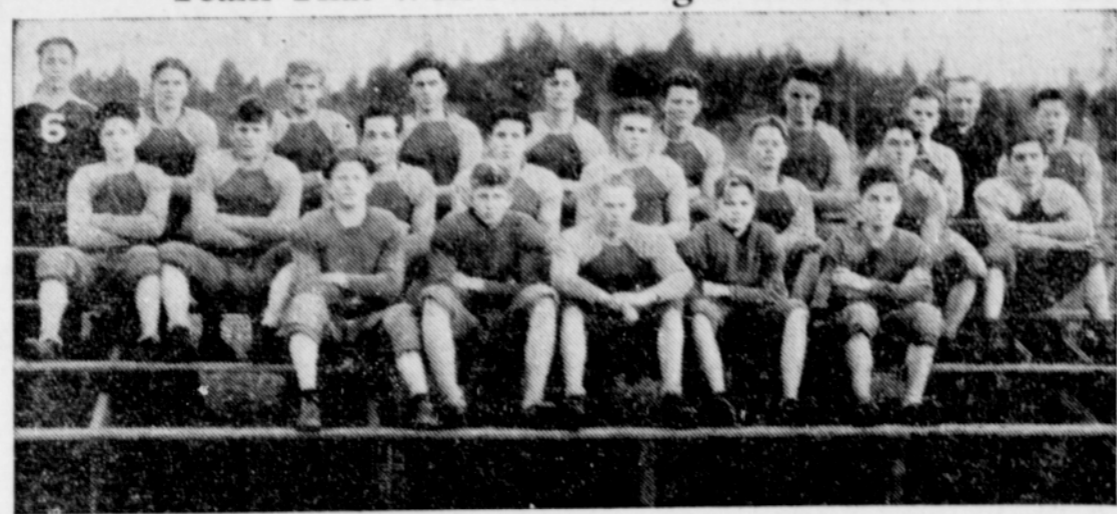


Hilhi Leads All-Star Team
