## Kansas Selects Property at Aloha as the Best

ALOHA—The property owners west of Huber avenue, which is the west end of District No. 2 to which point the creek is improved, are getting signers to a petition to the PWA for the continuance of Beaverton creek drainage. They will present the petition to Drainage District No. 2 to join them and try to improve the creek to the connection with Rock Creek. A delegation composed of Ray Antrim, Major Weisenbach, George Johnson and Mr. Hack met with members of district No. 2 at Beaverton Friday night to present their proposition and were met with much encouragement and advice as to procedure.

A public meeting will be called within the next two weeks, to familiarize the citizens of Aloha with the methods of procedure, and the benefits to be derived by the further improvement.

Mr. Antrim and Major Weisenbach were at Gladstone Saturday, in the interest of the project. If successful in getting the co-operation of the property owners to the junction of Rock Creek the WPA will set aside \$22,500 to be spent for labor in the vicinity, and expense to each property owner will be much less than the value of the land drained by the project.
