

Mrs. J Dobbs is Recovering

Local People Injured in Automobile Accident

Mrs. John F. Dobbs, wife of Pacific university's president, narrowly escaped asphyxiation Friday afternoon when she was knocked unconscious in a fall from a stool in her kitchen at Forest Grove, Dr. Dobbs found his wife in a gas-filled kitchen, carried her to the porch and called Fire Chief Walter Vandervelden. An inhalator was used for more than an hour before it was felt safe to transfer the woman to the Emanuel hospital in Portland.

The accident occurred when the heel of Mrs. Dobbs' slipper caught in the top of the stool as she was looking into a cupboard above the range. In falling she struck her head. Water in a double boiler on the stove boiled over, extinguishing the flame and allowing the gas to escape into the room. Louis Lomax and Lindsay McDaniel sustained head cuts and body bruises in an automobile collision early Sunday morning on the Canyon road west of Portland. Miss Patty Lomax, a passenger, suffered shock and a head bruise. The other car was driven by Harold McEwen of Portland.

Shortly after the first accident a car driven by Mr. Berggren, reportedly as of Hillsboro, crashed into the McEwen car, which juddered into its pathway. All three cars were badly damaged, but extent of injury to other persons involved is unknown. Lindsay had come north from March Field, Cal., where he is a student aviator, to attend the funeral of his brother, Kenneth, who was fatally injured in an automobile accident January 1. He was able to return south Sunday night. When O. Darnell suffered a wrenching back in an automobile accident near Tigard January 6, Driver of the other car was Earl Peterson.
