CHICKEN POX

(By Oregon State Board of Health) Chickn pox is an acute disease with slight fever and mild constitutional symptoms. The eruption consists of raised red spots no largthan the size of a pea. It may last for a few hours and is not often observed. These red spots de-velop into vesicles or small blisters ich last for three or four days and leave a granular scale. The eruption develops as abundantly on the covered parts of the body as on the exposed parts, and fre-quently appears in different stages on the same region.

Chicken pox is caused by a fil-terable virus, and is transmitted directly from person to person or Indirectly through articles soiled by discharges from infected per sons. All articles soiled by discharges from lesions should be boiled or disinfected. The disease is especially communicable in the early stages of the eruption.
