TIMBER—Grade school is shut down until February 10 because of measles and whooping cough. Approximately half of the pupils had measles last week.

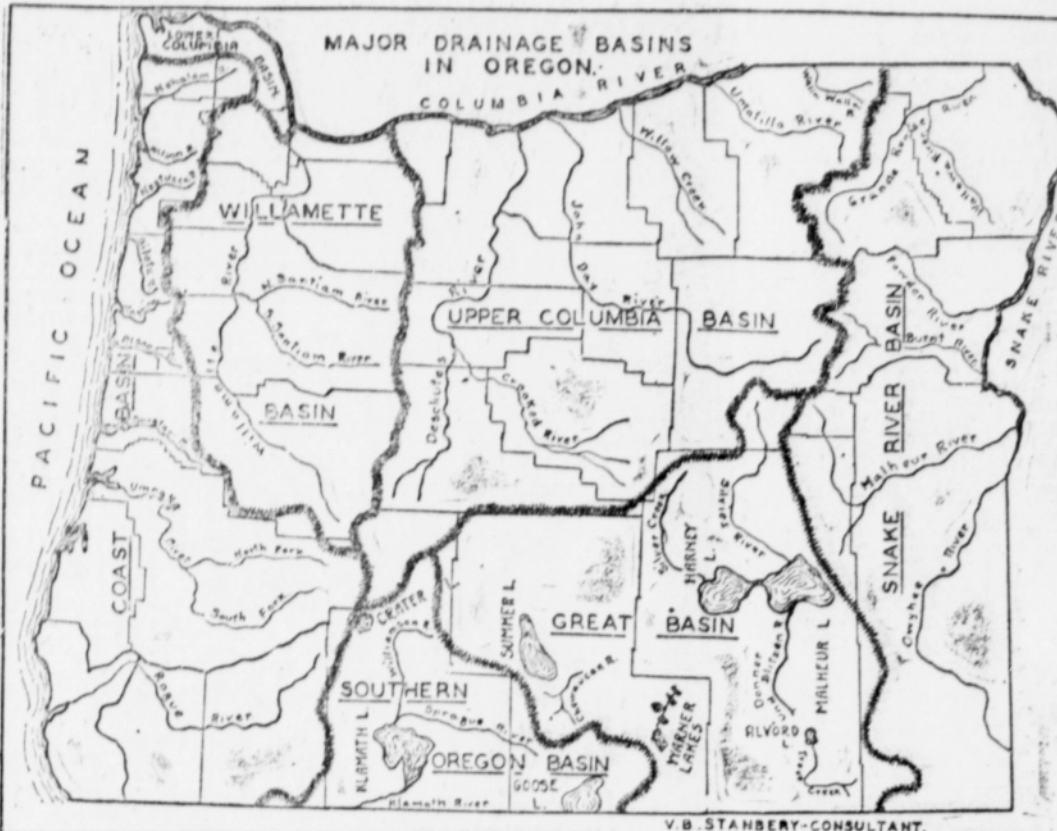
