

# Hillsboro Quintet Leads in County

## Two Victories Won by Locals

### St. Mary's, Tigard Teams Lose to Hillsboro

Hillsboro's blue and white basketball team came into its own over the week-end and took first place in the race for county championship by decisive victories over the Tigard and St. Mary's. Only two more county league games are still to be played before this year's team can repeat the championship action of last year.

Wahner, Hillsboro's fast forward, who had been temporarily eclipsed during the McMinnville game by Selfridge, came into action during the second quarter with two baskets to his credit. The first quarter had seen Selfridge sink a basket and make a good foul shot. In the second half of the game Baumgartner and Howell each had a basket, with Wahner and Selfridge shooting three and two respectively. The final score stood Hillsboro, 21, Tigard, 16. The game was played on the Tigard high floor Friday evening.

The Hills team also trounced St. Mary's aggregation, 25 to 16, in a very fast contest on the local floor Tuesday evening. Although the Saints were able to shoot eleven fouls to Hillsboro's six, Wahner's five goals in the first half insured a local victory. The score at half time stood 18 to 4 in favor of Hillsboro, and St. Mary's attempt to change the result during the second period, while it brought in 12 points for the Catholic five, was futile. Hall and J. Hughes were outstanding players on the Saints' team.

In preliminary games Hillsboro B squad lost to Tigard B squad, 8 to 22, and to St. Mary's B squad, 27 to 30. Tsugawa's shooting for baskets was a feature of the last game. On Tuesday afternoon the Hillsboro girls met St. Mary's and were completely routed, 30 to 10.

Under the rates being established, the government has required that there be 500 connections in the old sewer district at \$4 per year while there must be 600 new connections in the district to be established by the new sewer at \$15 per year. Totals prepared by the city engineers disclose that revenue raised will be in the neighborhood of \$12,000 a year, or slightly over the amount required by the government specifications for retirement of the bonds amounting to \$102,000.

### Ex-German Veteran Talks Communism

which a group rioted at the docking of the German cruiser Emden three weeks ago.  
This demonstration, he charged, was a communistic attempt to drive a wedge between the friendly relations of former Germany army men and the American Legion. Communists, he pointed out, detest a united front and attempt wherever possible to split organizations and government into factions, making their conquest easier.  
In Germany after the war, he he told how, with other veterans of the war, he attended every possible communist and labor meeting to learn the tactics and methods of communist propaganda. At these meetings, he declared, he saw the leaders of the movement and among them was the man who furnished the money. This man, he said, was in Portland three months ago but is now in Paris. His name, he said, was withheld because the man has a brother, who is a respected and honored citizen of Oregon.  
"But should this man ever return to Oregon," Wullert declared, "I shall give his name to the American Legion."  
Wullert said that communism was finally bridled in Germany when the leaders were caught and shot by the veterans. Death, he remarked, was the only law the communists knew or respected.  
During the war the ex-German soldier was employed in the city of Emden, where he had grown up, as a repairman in the shipyards, mostly on submarines. He told of being wrecked in a submarine at the bottom of the bay on a test run and being gassed when sea water flooded the battery room.  
Reports on the radio contest were given by Jake Weil and Arthur Kroeger and Leon S. Davis were appointed to a committee to submit a project to the National Youth administration in connection with the proposed remodeling of the Veterans' hall. Under the NYA, young men between the ages of 18 and 25 are employed in a manner similar to the WPA.  
Next Legion meeting, February 25, will be a joint session of the Legion and Auxiliary with a program furnished by Arthur Kroeger.
