More Luxury Liners of the Air May Circle World in Week by 1940

SO you think aviation has grown up? Then step for a little while into the laboratories and drafting rooms of the country's foremost airplane builders. You'll learn that the "baby" nurtured by the Wright brothers nearly 33 years ago is still a toddler.

So far as its engineering guardians are concerned, aviation has its full life ahead. In the interim the plans being laid and developed approach the fantastic.

They will enable you, for instance, if they succeed, to board a hermetically sealed cabin plane in Los Angeles to soar across the continent through the sub-stratosphere at five miles a minute. Plans for such a plane are already in shape for construction purposes.

Returning to America, you would fly back to the Pacific coast, likely taking advantage of a sleeper service which would tuck you away comfortably while your ship whirled through the night at 3 1/2 miles a minute. Now under construction, these huge ships are designed to carry 16 passengers by night and 32 by day.

The future seems unbounded. "Within the next five or ten years, around the world in a week will be entirely possible for the business-getter," predicts Col. Edgar Gorrell, newly appointed "czar" of the aviation industry.

And in the light of existing progress his prediction seems reasonable. Already aviation can point to the record-breaking 3357-mile flight of the nation's latest type patrol plane from the Panama Canal to Alameda, Calif.; to the epochal flights of the Sikorski Clipper, which has been blinding a new mail and passenger route across the hazardous Pacific; and to the general rapid growth of commercial flying.

Equally significant have been developments of a nationwide network of airmail transportation,

today. It will be priced to compare with automobiles and just as comfortable, may travel 30 to 40 miles an hour faster than the best car, and on the same amount of gasoline. When that day comes, the "baby" will be grown up.
