

### Scholls Farm Changes Hands

#### McDonald Property Sold to Truck Gardeners

Real estate sales during the month of April aggregating more than \$42,000, of which half was in cash, were reported this week by W. G. Ide, Hillsboro real estate agent.

The largest sale involved the McDonald ranch at Scholls, purchased last year from Fred Groner, which brought \$29,500. The sale was to G. Giusto and J. F. Garbarino of Portland, recent operators of truck gardens included in the tract of land sold for the purpose of the Columbia farms.

The men plan to operate a large truck garden, probably irrigated with water obtained from the Tualatin river. The ranch contains 340 acres, of which 290 acres are under cultivation. Of this amount 24 acres are in bearing almonds and four acres in Youngberries.

Two sales northwest of Forest Grove, in the Thatcher district, also were made, one to M. E. Williams of Portland of 40 acres, and the other to E. G. Place, also of Portland, and containing 21 acres.

Thirty-seven acres of farm land at Rex on the south edge of the county, were sold to G. H. Barrett of Portland, Ide reported, and a tract of 120 acres on Pumpkin Ridge to George Hackett, who attached the property to his farm there.

A sale near Hillsboro includes 105 acres owned by Catherine Collins and adjoining the A. J. Ray country estate which was sold to an unnamed buyer, Ide said.

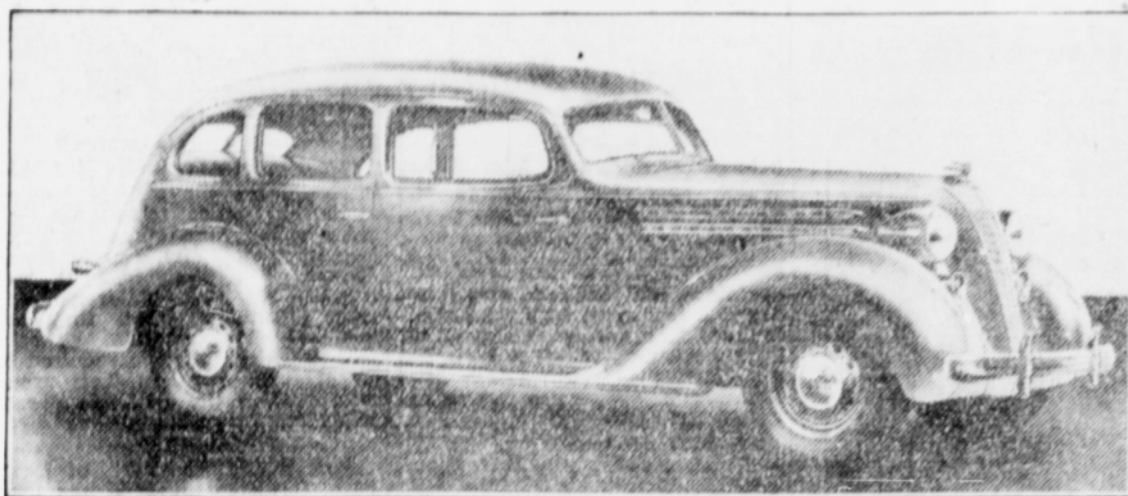
