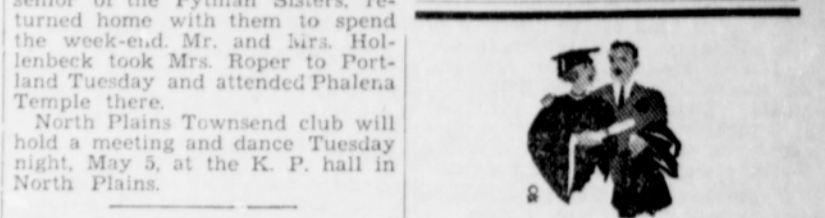

Miss Ardis Nelson, who formerly resided here, was married in Portland April 14.

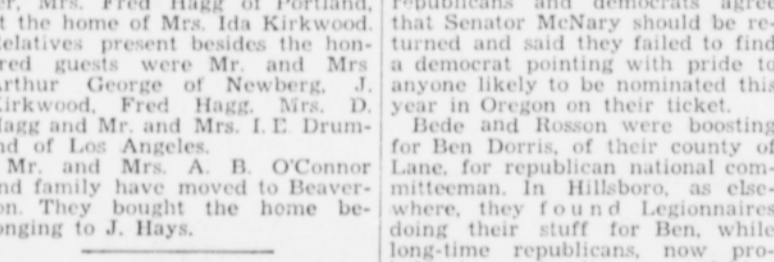
