Postpone Play Account Rain

"Smoke-Eaters" Expect Hot Struggle at Aloha

Jupiter Pluvius took a hand in the Sunset League game Sunday and emptied his rain bucket to such an extent that play had to be postponed. The game will be played at a later date and next Sunday's play will be as scheduled.

In the Eastern Sunset League Tualatin goes to Williamette, Newberg to Orenco. Garden Home to Sherwood and Hillsboro will journey to Aloha, for what is expected to be one of the hardest games of the season.

In the Western, Twin Oaks plays at Vernonia, Sauvie Island comes to Verboort, Banks to North Plains and Cornelius to Scappoose.

Hillsboro boys have faced two extremely good teams, the first two games and have proven themselves a fine ball club. Little can be told of Aloha's relative strength as they have not played any of the same teams that Hillsboro has. Upon general appearances and comparative scores this year Aloha appears to have the best hitting club as the Aloha batsmen have batted in runs in the two games they have played against Hillsboro's 6. the league, having only one run scored against them in two games, while Aloha has allowed 9 runners to cross the plate.

"Lefty" Smith of Aloha has not yet lost a game in the Sunset League. Last year he won seven games while with Aloha, and has won two so far this year. Rosky, Hillsboro's ace, won 12 and lost 1 last year and has won both his starts this season. Smith is considered the most effective pitcher in the league and has played semi-pro ball for many years. On account of his wider experience and greater knowledge he is given the edge in the pitching department.

When Rosky is "on" he can give opposing batsmen plenty of trouble and is out to beat Aloha if possible, as this team was responsible for his single defeat last year.

Both teams are undefeated and 8 goals for either team may be disastrous as it is generally believed that the first half title lies between Williamette, Aloha and Hillsboro, as these three teams as yet are undefeated and neither team wants to risk the shame of being eliminated.

Last year Hillsboro defeated Aloha the first 6 to 5. The second half Aloha beat Hillsboro 6 to 6. In the race off for the title Hillsboro won the first game 6 to 3, Aloha won the second 3 to 2 and Hillsboro won the second and deciding game 7 to 2. So past scores indicate a close game. Hillsboro batters have always been bothered by southpaws as the Hillsboro roster is well cluttered with left-handed hitters, having seven who bat from the port side on the regular lineup.

Hillsboro has entered the "Smoke Eaters" in a state championship tournament to be held at Vaughn street park June 29 to July 18. A team must be defeated twice in order to be eliminated and 16 of the best teams of the state will be selected to compete. As yet no definite announcement has been made of the teams selected. All games will be played at night.
