Principal work projects for main camp C.C. men during the present month will be snag falling, road maintenance and telephone line construction.

Blading, ditching and general maintenance will be required on the Louisa road. Johnson and Wheeler roads, including a total length of some 30 miles.

Another thread in the network of telephone lines that enable lookouts to keep in touch with forest fire fighting headquarters will be completed with the construction of a telephone line from the Round Top lookout tower near Timber to the Green Mountain lookout near Jewell in Clatsop county. This 5 1/2 miles of construction will tie in with Meadow Lake lookout and fire headquarters at Forest Grove.
