### Farm Population of State Makes Substantial Gain

Number of persons living on farms and ranches in Oregon increased 25,100, or 11.2 per cent, between April 1, 1930, and January 1, 1935, according to a special report of the 1935 farm census. The state's farm and ranch population of 248,767 consisted of 244,734 white persons and 4033 colored. On Jan-uary 1, 1935, of the persons on farm and ranches, 45,141, or 18.1 per cent, lived in non-farm residences five years earlier. Movement of persons to farms and ranches was most extensive in the counties along the Willamette, Umpqua, and Rogue River valleys, and around

Washington county reported 16 .-292 farm population on January 1, 1935, in contrast with 15,702 on April 1, 1930. White population for the county showed 4143 farms reporting with 16,094 white people. Farms with colored people in the county totaled 39 and the population on these 39 farms was 198. Persons on farms January 1, 1935, who lived in non-farm residences five years scaling totaled 2006. five years earlier totaled 3006 on 1074 farms. Occupied dwellings on 4178 farms reporting in this coun-ty totaled 4656. Two hundred seventy-seven farms were reported
