P-T. A. Conducts Health Round-up for New Pupils

Hillsboro Parent-Teacher association is conducting a summer round-up of children who will enter school this fall, to make it possible for all children to be physically fit before starting to school. This health project which consists of physical, dental and eye examinations, is receiving the enthusiastic co-operation of parents and all the doctors and dentists in town. The latter are donating their services for these examinations. Mrs. Charles Douglass, chairman of the summer round-up committee, hopes to have these examinations completed in June, so that those in need of medical or dental attention can have it taken care of before school starts. Members of this committee are now calling on parents of children who will enter school this fall, giving them full information on the summer round-up health project and leaving examination blanks to be filled out by a physician and dentist.

The summer round-up of children has been a national project of Parent-Teacher organizations for the past 11 years. This work was conducted in Hillsboro last year by the P-T. A. after school started, the examinations taking place in the schools in the form of a clinic, but this year the work is being done more thoroughly as each child is being examined individually in the offices of the doctors and dentists. In this manner it is hoped that all children entering school this fall will be in perfect physical condition.
