Washington county school districts, numbering 115, containing 9307 persons of school age, were apportioned \$11,746.25 of Washington county's share of the state ir-reducible school fund, beginning Tuesday afternoon when checks were mailed, according to O. B. Kraus, county school superintendent.

Hillsboro received \$1473.75 for 1179 persons. Forest Grove \$921.25 for 737; Beaverton \$638 for 527; Tigard, \$563 for 468; Aloha-Huber, \$505 for 404; Metzger, \$292.50 for 234; Sherwood, \$267.50 for 214; and Cornelius, \$251.25 for 201. Smaller districts received less in proportion to the number of persons of school age.

Each district is allowed \$125 per capita. About half the districts received their quota, the others having failed to file clerk's bonds.
