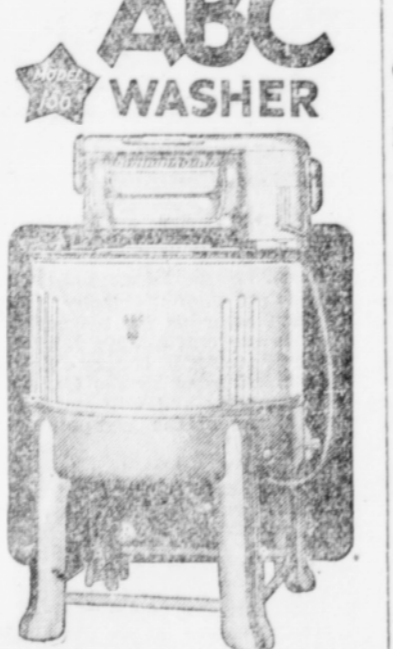

Hare Speaker at Rotary Session; Reactions Cited

Impressions of his recent trip east, in which he attended the 30th annual reunion of his law class at the University of Michigan, were given Rotarians Thursday by William G. Hare. He was accompanied as far as Denver by Mrs. Hare.

Hare told Rotarians that he discovered while attending his class reunion that he was very much in the middle of the road from a political standpoint in contrast with the extreme standpatters on the one side and radicals on the other. He pointed out that prior to the depression the great trend was toward centralization with a few powerful interests attempting to usurp the control of the country's wealth, a system of "economic feudalism," in which, he said, many of his classmates seemed to believe. As for himself, Hare said he preferred having many individual and independent ownerships and control.

Referring to his drive back over the old Oregon Trail, which his parents covered by ox team in pioneer days, Hare declared that he lost patience with those who feel that the government owes them a living. He pointed out that he covered in a few hours what pioneers laboriously traversed in months.
