Non-Suit Filed in Forrester Action

Following arguments before Judge R. Frank Peters, in circuit court Saturday, A. H. Forrester, Portland engineer, was granted a voluntary non-suit as to George McGee, city manager, in the action to collect damages against the city of Hillsboro. Plaintiff was allowed to file an amended complaint excluding McGee.

No-suit as to McGee was taken on the grounds, as presented by P. L. Patterson, city attorney, that either the city council or McGee was responsible and that both could not be held liable in one action.

Forrester is suing for \$26,650, alleging that he was hired by the city to make improvements and gather data for the installation of a sewage disposal plant and that part of his plans were included in the present plant.

German Showers, 48, arrested April 6 on a morals charge, pleaded guilty in circuit court Wednesday morning and was sentenced to seven years in the penitentiary by Judge R. Frank Peters.

This morning (Thursday) L. E. Stairet, charged with obtaining money under false pretenses by issuing a check without funds, will appear in court for trial.
