**European Ideal of Housing as
Experienced Seems to be High**

MUNICH, Germany.—The art of good eating in Europe is the art of avoiding too much meat. Even at that meal is likely to surprise one by coming to the table under some other name—for instance as one of the many varieties of "schnitzel." "Schnitzel" apparently means anything cut into slices, either thick or thin, and, however, it may look on the menu, there is at least a 50-50 chance that it will turn out to be veal.

Oregon probably has the best fruit and vegetables in the world—Europe must claim its superiority elsewhere. The old theory that Pacific coast fruit looks fine, but lacks delicacy of taste in comparison with that of other regions is simply not true. Rather extensive listing closing hours for such correspondence is scheduled to reach its destination after regular delivery hours.

The postmaster pointed out that air mail is often delayed unnecessarily due to the fact that carriers fail to post their letters in time to make connections with southbound and eastbound planes. Air mail destined for California should reach the post office not later than 6:30 p. m. and that for the midwest and east by 6:30 p. m. Air mail postage is six cents an ounce.

Postmaster McPhee emphasized that air mail is less expensive and frequently more effective than special delivery regular mail. He also called attention to the fact that air mail special delivery often can be used to advantage when such correspondence is scheduled to reach its destination after regular delivery hours.
