Williams Herd Leads in County for Production

High producing cow for the month of July, according to the report of the Washington county herd testing association, was in the herd of Mrs. Tom Williams. This cow produced 1215 pounds of milk containing 82.5 pounds of fat. The second high producer was in the C. B. Buchanan Jr herd with 1289 pounds of milk and 77.8 pounds of fat for the month.

High herd for the month was the Mrs. Tom Williams herd with an average of 822 pounds of milk and 46.79 of fat. First in herds of 12 to 20 cows was the John Mulloy herd with 849 pounds of milk average and 42.78 of fat. In smaller herds, C. H. Bamford's Jerseys led with 825 pounds of milk and 42.7 fat.

vitamin A, it often happens that the tear glands of the eye cease to function. This leaves the eyeball dry and weakens its resistance to pathogenic bacteria. If an infection occurs, it may become progressively more serious unless foods containing vitamin A are eaten. This condition, which is known as xerophthalmia, is most prevalent among children. In Denmark, during the World War, xerophthalmia grew to epidemic proportions among undernourished children who were being fed on skimmed milk and other foods lacking in vitamin A. As soon as the symptoms were recognized, the government ordered that butter and milk containing butterfat be added to their diet, and the condition was remedied.

Since vitamin A is such an important factor in growth, development, and health, it is essential that everyone, children especially, eat foods containing it. This statement is doubly true during the winter season, for it is then that colds and many other infectious diseases are most prevalent. There is strong suggestive evidence that low intake of vitamin A increases susceptibility to the development of pulmonary tuberculosis in the adolescent period. Thus a high intake of this vitamin is important for the growing child, particularly during the adolescent period.

See that your children eat plenty of eggs, milk and cream. If fresh or canned green vegetables and dairy products are not available, cod-liver oil and animal livers may be used as substitutes. A fact worthy of note is that vitamin A is not destroyed by ordinary cooking, pasteurization or canning. Although a deficiency in vitamin A might not immediately result disastrously for you or your children, its effects over a period of years might culminate in a lack of normal growth, physical debility, and injury to various parts of the body.

Views on Safety Given by Expert

"Women are just as efficient and careful in the operation of motor vehicles as men." Such was the statement of R. W. Haven, member of the Chicago staff of the National Safety Council, in a radio interview conducted by Earl Snell, secretary of state, recently.

Based on years of observation of drivers and on investigation of many accidents, Mr. Haven's conclusions provide an answer to the motor-age question that is advanced from time to time by ardent or partisan champions of both sexes as to their respective qualifications as drivers.

Other points stressed by the safety expert in answer to questions of Secretary Snell were his belief that inattention is the major cause of accidents, that adequate policing is more essential than a fixed speed limit, and that uniformity in laws of the various states is an important factor in the safety program.

Of the three "E's" of highway safety, enforcement, engineering and education which are emphasized in the safety council's program, Mr. Haven holds education the most important, although he believes all three are necessary for success in accident elimination. Instruction in safety in the schools is included in the council's plan and it is advocated that accident

prevention be a part of the regular curriculum in every school. A five-year program has been inaugurated by the council, according to Mr. Haven, the objective to be a 35 per cent reduction in all accidents during the period. The co-operation of the Oregon department in this program has been assured by the secretary of state.

Frank Schaefer of Timber, arrested by sheriff's deputies on a charge of threatening to commit a felony, was released on bond Thursday afternoon following his arrest in the morning.
