Extension Center Opening on September 28

portunity of availing ourselves of this information and on November 3, registering our decision.

"In January the legislature will meet in regular session and as in times past much new legislation effecting each of us will be enacted. Many bills will be introduced and of these as always many will effect our own local affairs. Attempts will be made to take away some of the advantages which we in Washington county have enjoyed

through the enactment of past legislation.

"These are only a few of the many subjects which must have a definite and sound state policy and which must be safeguarded for the interests of the people. The importance of careful consideration of these vital problems must not be overlooked if we, as a county and a state, are to continue our stride toward economic stability and secure and maintain for ourselves the benefits that we are justly entitled to."

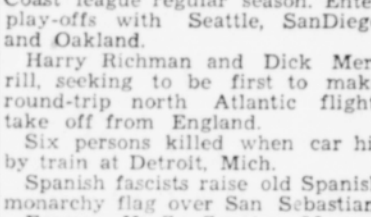

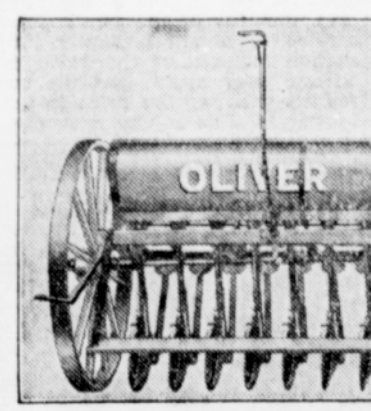

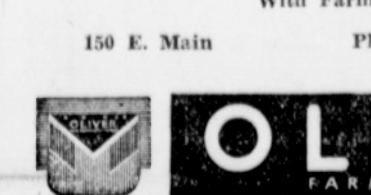
