## Two Contest for Place as Mayor Here

### Hugh Rogers Files Petition; Friends Seek Re-election Mayor Garrett

### J. Person Withdraws

### Citizens Nominate Kroeger and E. A. Griffith

The city political pot came to a full boil last week with candidates' petitions filed or about to be filed from each of the three wards, and a contest in the offing for city mayor.

In the north ward, a petition is on file with the city recorder nominating E. A. Griffith, prominent real estate dealer, Petition for Arthur Kroeger, manager of the Hillsboro Concrete Brick & Tile company, has been filed from the southwest ward and a petition is being circulated for Mrs. C. E. Wells in the southeast ward.

### State Commander

Hugh Rogers, state commander of the Spanish American War Veterans, already on file for mayor and petitions for J. H. Garrett, incumbent in this office, are being circulated.

J. M. Person, councilman from the north ward, declared in a statement to the Argus this week that he fully appreciated the efforts being made by his friends to obtain his nomination, but that he felt that his business demanded his full time. He has definitely withdrawn, he declared.

Much the same statement was made by Fred Engeldinger, local druggist, who withdrew his petition after friends began its circulation. He said that he felt that in the nomination of Kroeger, an able man had been brought into the race. He appreciated the loyalty of his friends, he declared, but felt that he could not make the race at this time.
